The FDA recently authorized the first COVID-19 vaccines. Here's what this means for you.



Even good news comes with questions. To help, we've answered some of the most common ones that may be on your mind.

- **Are they safe?**
After rigorous testing, Food and Drug Administration (FDA) experts have determined the COVID-19 vaccines to be safe and effective for adults.
- **How much will they cost?**
Cigna will cover FDA-authorized vaccines as a preventive service, so it will be available at no additional cost to you.*
- **When can I get my vaccine?**
Priority will be given to frontline health care workers, residents and staff of long-term care facilities, people with underlying medical conditions and those over age 65.** Your doctor is the best person to ask if you can get your vaccine now or at a later date.
- **Should I still wear my mask?**
We urge you to continue proper mask wearing, social distancing and practice good hand washing until enough people are vaccinated to control the spread of the virus.
